

If you have any ideas which could prove helpful in improving this book for future years I would appreciate suggestions in order that I could pass them on to next year's editor.


In closing, I would like to say that I hope you will get as much pleasure out of reading this book as I have in producing it.





Alpha Chi was a little shaky at the start of 1963, but with the re-election of Matt Farrett as President on Jan. 13 and the election of a good executive we are now




All in all it has been a very active and successful season for Beta Beta.

THE FRATERNITY HOUSE


we like those pizza parties.


Again I must thank you all, both board and chapters, for your confidence and co-operation in the past year and wish you all the best in your future. Thank you.

In the near future the Hockey Tournament begins and our first game is against Beta Mu, which we will beat, naturally. Why? Because we are going to be the Fraternity Champions.




L. R. STANDING - BILL MOOR, PAUL BARRY, ROGER PAAS, BILL HARVEY, DAVE ULRICH.


We are now engaged in our second pledge period and after starting with 6 goats are now down to 5 with 2 weeks to go. The rest appear to be good material to build a strong chapter.

Before I go into the Hell Night I must again state that our town is not fraternity minded so some of the stunts may appear to be mild; believe me they weren't.




Our next event is our Bossa Nova Beat and we hope it will be just as much fun and quite a bit more profitable.



radio station and G.D.P. is competing against the other fraternities in the area.
