PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE

The new year is full of plans to strengthen the fraternity. It will start off with a northern rally in January. Then there will be a president's conference in February or March. There will also be a southern rally in March. The hockey tournament will be played in that month also. In April there will be a Founder's Day Banquet and the final rally in May.

The last effort will be for the convention in Toronto, which we are planning to be one of the best yet. I would like to apologize for the late printing of the Grip but that was due to inactiveness of the board in the fall term. We are still planning to have 3 issues this year.

I hope that this year new Brothers will offer assistance to the board. For without the support of the Chapters and the Brothers, we cannot do anything. There are many plans but they can only be continued and carried through by the help and support of the Brothers.

In conclusion I hope that this year will improve. We have many new ideas and we hope you will agree with them, and help us carry them forward into action. For without help the board cannot do anything.

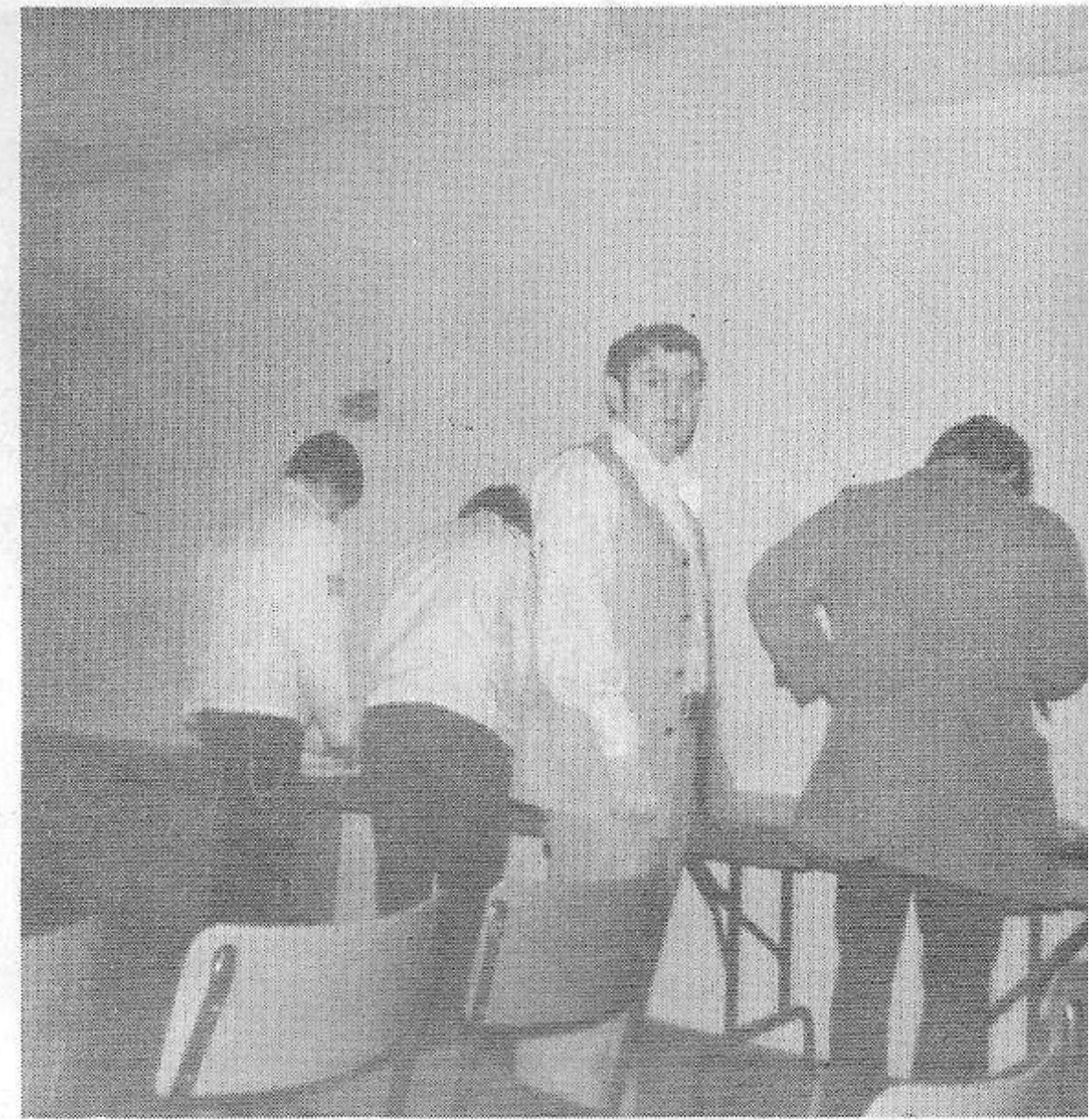

- At the 1941 convention a clause in the preamble of the Constitution "we the students of the various scholastic institutions of learning in the North American Continent . . . " thus paving the way for the entrance of Canadian Chapters.
- the Red Carnation was adopted as the fraternity's flower in 1941.
