## CONVENTION CHAPTER REPORTS

### Alpha Chi:

The brothers of Alpha Chi Chapter helped out in a local walkathon by volunteering 26 brothers to fill fobs of crossing guards. In our last two pledge periods things have gone well. We sent out 23 letters this year with 22 showing up to pledge and 8 finally becoming brothers. The first term we sent out 14 letters with 12 showing up and 6 finishing. At the present we have a total of 23 active brothers and \$45.00 in the bank account.

The brothers held a fashion show with a local sorority Alpha Beta Psi. Although we lost \$50.00 attendace was excellent and it proved to be a successful event.

Donations to charities have been many with \$700.00 to the Big Brother Association, \$550.00 to the United Appeal, \$250.00 to the Red Cross, and \$750.00 to the Cancer Society. We lost \$200.00 on our father and son baquet and \$150.00 on the Fashion show.

At the present we owe \$90.00 to a chocolate bar company and \$75.00 to a novelty company and \$175.00 to the Grand Council.

This past Wednesday night we inducted two new brothers into the chapter to 151 and active to 11. This year we inducted 5 new brothers into the chapter. Now as it has been for a long time it is sometimes difficult to get pledges for we still go by our old ways just a s small amount.

We also ventured into many smaller money making projects such as raffles, car washes, and donut sales.

At this point brotherhood was great and there were few problems within the Chapter. To ever further boost our spirits and bring us closer together, we acquired a Fraternity house in Dinwiddie, Virginia. From the month of October thru the month of March, this Fraternity House not only enabled Beta Tau to become stronger and closer as a Chapter, but also improved relationships between Beta Tau and several other Southern Chapters.
