
Best of luck to all Brothers and never forget that Gamma Delta Psi will return ten-fold for every effort put forth.





ALPHA CHI

Alpha Chi had a very successful year in 1973-74, by holding various tapelines, fashion shows, car washes, etc. to raise money for charities in the Oakville area. We also canvassed for the Canadian Cancer Society for the fourth straight year. Our treasury has swindled some compared with last year because most of our money has gone to charities. We have had two pledge periods with eleven new brothers being inducted. We now have an active list of 28 brothers. The executive tried to keep the brotherhood thriving by arranging activities for all the brothers to participate in. We had many functions with sororities and basketball games with Alpha Zeta fraternity.

The chapter participated in all the fraternity functions, as well as being finalists in the hockey tournament as well as the basketball tournament. Right now Alpha Chi is made up of one fine group of young men, who, to me are a lot more than just brothers, they are friends who you can trust and receive help from. We strongly believe in togetherness and we all try and help each other out. This is why fraternity is a success in our chapter. We are still without question the No. 1 chapter in Oakville, and we strongly feel that we are No. 1 in Gamma Delta Psi Fraternity International. (our enrollment is up to 234 brothers since 1955).

Thus the years in the future look bright for our chapter and we hope that the fraternity also has a bright future.

BETA ALPHA

Beta Alpha has really been on the uprise this past year with twelve new brothers who were inducted last September. Our chapter is young, but learning fast and working hard.

At the beginning of the year we had close to \$65.00 in our treasury, but with a lot of help from the old members we are now over \$400.00. Dues have all been paid and no debts are owed. The beginning of the year brought fifteen brothers out and now the active list tops at twenty-five, since we inducted four new brothers in April.

Correspondence was good compared to other years with 600 letters being sent out thanks to our corresponding secretary Brother Marks. Civics projects were many including collection for the March of Dimes and Muscular Dystrophy. Brothers also painted the local radio station, WHAP for free, just to have them announce the chapter over the radio.

The chapter raised money from raffles, car washes and having a joint dance with Beta Tau. We would like to thank all the brothers who attended. The chapter spent some of the money by having a dinner for our sister sorority and at this time we also named this year's sweetheart, Leia Demet.

This past year, we have attended every board meeting since December and all rallies. The chapter also attended other chapter meetings such as those of Gamma Theta and Beta Tau. We found this so successful that we now have formed a committee to arrange meetings with other chapters.

One of our best accomplishments was that we were the first to hear from Brother Malcolm Dixon and the first to begin correspondence with him. This past year, has been a busy one for everyone. All the brothers of Beta Alpha have worked hard and that is why Beta Alpha is still No. 1!

DISTRICT DEPUTIES - NORTH

There are three chapters in the Niagara region. (Gamma Xi, Beta Xi, and Gamme Eta) All three chapters have been active in various degrees at various times of the year.

Gamma Xi most definitely heads the list as the most active of the three chapters in my area. They not only attended all fraternity functions but did so en mass. They have a strong group of young brothers who are bubbling with enthusiasm, but they suffer from the lack of experience that the older chapters have. Gamma Xi is a good chapter, but as this fraternal year draws to an end and a new one approaches the experience can only benefit Gamma Xi and make it a stronger chapter in the following years.

Beta Xi has definitely had its problems in this fraternal year. The year for Beta Xi started as though it was going to be dead. The brothers of Beta Xi managed to regroup themselves and salvage the chapter. Athletically Beta Xi has been excellent, winning the hockey and Basketball tournaments. They however have had poor attendance at most other fraternity functions. The upcoming year for Beta Xi poses new challenges as they will again have to fight for survival.



BETA TAU





The fraternity house has enabled the chapter to have their weekly chapter meetings there. The house also served as a means of increasing brotherhood by letting the brothers work side by side in repairing the roof, floor, painting and numerous other things.

The house served as a great social place to hold chapter keg and grain parties. The different parties also helped the treasury. The treasury now stands at \$400.00 give or take a dollar, compared to only \$100.00 last year. The activities for the year included raffles, films, carwashes, selling stationary. The chapter also sponsored a baseball team on the city league and we also held our annual softball tournament. Beta Pi has also planned a chapter reunion, the first one in the chapter's history. Our Sweetheart Dance was a big hit financially and sweetheart wise. Beta Pi also attended every rally and most of the board meetings in full force.

This year has not been a good year for the chapter. We have run into financial problems, along with numerous other problems such as no correspondence from the chapter. The biggest setback was the loss of our fraternity house which we had only had for one year.





JAMES FERMOILE STAG


