

PRESIDENTIAL ADDRESS

Greetings, all. It's Mike here again with yet another edition of our monthly newsletter, the 'GRIP'. The 'GRIP' has simply out done itself once more. As successive issues are produced, the 'paper begins to take on definite character traits. In this March '83 issue, you will undoubtedly notice the addition of a comic strip entitled, 'Brother A.J. Brewski: Fraternal Investigator'. Also, the 'L.T.D.' column takes on a slightly different cosmetic appearance.

I should start off my monthly address by summing up the IBC's activities in a few succinct lines. Well, with the exception of last month's production of the 'GRIP' and an informal gathering, the Board took a short sabbatical from Fraternal affairs.

Plans for our first annual 'Great Northern Keg Party' fell through because of a severe lack of monetary funds to invest. Reason being that the IBC has previous obligations with the production and financing of the Grand Brother ceremonies in April and May. In place of our proposed March semi-formal, we will be hosting a Northern Rally - see the Coming Events column for more detailed info.

I attended my first Trustees' meeting a few weeks ago in St. Catharines. A quorum being present, many discrepancies were resolved and plans for the remainder of the year instituted. Next meeting is scheduled for Tuesday, March 22 in Toronto.

Speaking of IBC expenditures for postage, I've got a couple of choice words. My total expenditures including four editions of the 'GRIP' (about 120 copies) and nearly 90 letters have amounted to \$110. This does not include money spent by the other officers on postage. All of this in only seven months.

Due to our pathetic excuse for a Federal government and their henchmen, the Canadian Postal Service; they apparently deem it necessary to hike postage rates as often as Ronald Regan changes his underalls. At a recent IBC gathering, we briefly discussed the establishment of a minimal cover charge (for the 'GRIP') to help subsidize the increasing cost of postage.

Since it costs about \$20 to mail the average size issue of about 30 copies, I have estimated that with inflation it will cost us anywhere from \$200 to \$250 annually to produce the 'paper. Because revenue to the IBC is almost restricted to the dependence on chapter dues, we have held a few social functions in hopes of securing our financial situation. Although, we've succeeded to a minor degree, we do have other expenses to meet.

Thus, a subscription rate and basis for the 'GRIP' seems probable, but not definite. Until Convention '83, the 'GRIP' will be provided gratis. The proposition for subscription may go as follows: For a meager \$5 you will receive 10 issues of the 'GRIP' (June-July & Aug-Sept are double issues). That's a lousy .50¢ per issue for a 'paper which is informative, inspiring, intriguing, occasionally whimsical, and a reasonable excuse for state-of-the-art journalism.

" THE 'GRIP': IN RETROSPECT "

' As Gamma Delta Psi Fraternity International starts into its eighty-ninth year, the Grand Crescent has twenty-seven active chapters. There are five in Virginia, two in New York state and twenty in Ontario, Canada. The Fraternity also has five active Crescent Clubs, which we will endeavour to make worthy of induction. '

The paragraph above originally appeared in the February 1968 edition of the 'GRIP' and was its opening article. Although, you must admit that Fraternity did sound impressive back then, it was not the peak for Gamma. Later on, the Fraternity blossomed to thirty-three active chapters across the North and South.

In that particular edition of the 'GRIP', its entire content was fit onto only three and a half pages. Not much, you say. Well, maybe. I am not making light of the fact that the 'GRIP' was leaner in earlier times because obviously the Fraternity was in a stabler frame of mind. Due to men such as Grand Brothers Guthrie and Marskell as well as Trustee Barry Yeates.

From the various editions of the 'GRIP' of years past, I've found them to be informative and newsworthy; which is what they were intended to be. The 'paper was basically a no-frills publication which was just fine because that's what was needed to catch the interest of the Fraternal body.

Today, a great deal has changed through different attitudes, life styles, and moral standards. Thus, the 'GRIP' has evolved accordingly. A simple comparison of yesterday's newsletter with today's will indicate that we now implicate sensationalism. The 'GRIP' is the voice of Gamma; a newsletter to inform, inspire and motivate.

The 'GRIP' is tradition and as much a part of our Fraternity as our Constitution, colors, rituals, and Brotherhood.

Yes, Virginia there really is a 'paper called the 'GRIP' ...




