PRESIDENTIAL ADDRESS

4/15/83

Greetings all. Happy Birthday, Gamma Delta Psi! Ol' Gamma is celebrating the big 'One-O-Four' on April 13th. That's 104 years of the World's Finest Brotherhood. April also marks the month in which Kevin Stockdale will be inducted into the 'Order Of The Grand Crescent'.

Just after completion of the March '83 edition of the 'GRIP', the IBC was again the center of inner-conflict. On March 2/83, I requested the immediate resignations of two Board members. Brothers Brett Crook and Marcel Beaulieu, the Secretary-Treasurer and Northern District Deputy respectively, reluctantly submitted to my request. A report of greater depth and magnitude is featured later on in this edition.

At this time, I must make some reference to the pathetic attendance and apparent lack of interest displayed by certain Northern chapters at last month's rally. ' RESIGNATION OF IBC OFFICERS '

On March 2/83, I requested the resignations of Brett Crook (interim Secretary-Treasurer) and Marcel Beaulieu (District Deputy) to take effect immediately.

Without prosecuting or defaming their characters, I will endeavor to present the facts surrounding my decision. The decision to relieve these Brothers from active posts was neither spontaneous nor without just cause.

As President, I believe there are certain privileges one has on the International Board of Control. Certainly, the fact that a Brother is serving on the IBC is a privilege within itself. This should not be abused, but conversely treated with respect and some degree of honor.

It was my opinion that Brothers Crook and Beaulieu neglected to fulfill their primary duties as outlined in our Constitution. At times, they hesitated, then procrastinated, and finally became reluctant to do the necessary work.

In the past, Fraternity has witnessed Board members who have not done as much as they should have. Well, that seems to be common place amongst some recent officers. The IBC is here to serve the Fraternity as an active governing body. I believe an essential part of my role is to see that the elected officers do faithfully carry out their duties.

I can assure you all with the highest integrity, that I took measures above and beyond reason to help the other Brothers in adhering to their chores. After all, how much work can I possibly do before doing it all myself?

At the time of the mentioned Brothers' dismissal, I felt that the Fraternity (or more directly, serving on the IBC) was not something which was a priority in their lives. I knew that they would not be able to make the sacrifices to allow themselves to serve the Fraternity in an acceptable manner i.e. their interests outside of Gamma Delta Psi grossly outweighed their dedication to the Fraternity's welfare.

There are many more underlying details which surrounded this predicament which I am unable to go into at present. Brother Shawn Stewart was appointed Northern District Deputy to fill in the void until next Convention. I will continue to tend to the duties of the Secretary-Treasurer's office.

Also, as you should have all read by now, the probability of a subscription rate seems certain. Currently, about 30 monthly copies are distributed as follows: IBC - 6; Trustees - 8; Chapters - 7; Gamma Psi - 3; Alumni - 3; Past-IBC President - 1; Grand Brothers - 1; and Alpha Beta Psi Sorority in C/O Shellie Archer.

104 YEARS OF BROTHERHOOD

Question: What is 104 years old and not just what it used to be? Answer: The Brotherhood presently being shown to the likes of Gamma Delta Psi Fraternity International.

Take a moment to consider the following: Imagine that somehow in some way, our Fraternity was stripped clean of its symbols of identification (Constitution, Motto, etc.). I believe the only thing which would remain intact is our Brotherhood.

Brotherhood is an intangible entity which is the essence of our Fraternity's existence and survival. It's the heart, soul, and life line which supports Gamma Delta Psi. Most importantly, Brotherhood is not even conceivable without us, the Brothers.

Our Fraternity is unique in many aspects, most notably the fact that we are 104 years old and an international Fraternity. Anyway you slice it, existing for over one hundred years is quite an accomplishment for an organization of our nature.

Have you all ever sat back to realize that our Fraternity has successfully fought off Father Time over the years? Gamma has witnessed, and to some extent experienced two World Wars, anti-Fraternity legislation, the uproar and uneasiness of the sixties, the great Depression, the threat of nuclear warfare, and even the movement of the influential 'Drug Culture'. Maybe 'Perseverance' really is our middle name.

I have often wondered what our founding Brothers were feeling back on April 13, 1879 when they signed the original charter. Do you think their attitudes towards Fraternity reasonably compared with those present in say 1939, 1957, or 1983?

I can tell you all without looking into the archives that in every time period, Brothers were praising Fraternity for its pride, dignity, and Brotherhood. 'The bringing together of kindred spirits for the mutual benefit and social enjoyment' is more than an adage of the Fraternity. It was the sound reasoning behind our conception.

It is obvious that our Fraternity has seen better days of expansion, involvement, and awareness, but in no way are we at a low point of security in our history. It will be a balmy day in Siberia before Gamma Delta Psi kicks back and says, 'Sorry folks, Fraternity's finished'. Gamma is too great of a force (if you will) to roll over.

One hundred and four years isn't something which goes without special note or distinction. At this age, Fraternity has to be nurtured and cared for in the same respect as a human being. If it is neglected or ignored, then it is destined to grow weak and soon perish.

Gamma Delta Psi doesn't know the meaning of the word 'Apathy', but I somehow think we're trying awfully hard to learn it. The Fraternity is greater than any one person or group of people. We (the Brothers) hold the key to the success of our future. We really do control our destiny.

William Shatner once remarked, 'The success is in the effort'. Thus, if there is some noticeable effort, then success can only logically follow. The future for Gamma Delta Psi is bright and promising because that's what we desire. Just as the words to the old song go, 'Dreams never die, only the dreamer'.

We are very fortunate to have such a glorified past, so let's use it to help build for our future. The time for Gamma Delta Psi is now.

A GLIMPSE INTO HISTORY

Gamma Delta Psi was founded at Hill House High School in 1879 in NewHaven, Connecticut. Gamma was founded by Brothers No. 1 Walter Rawlings Dann, No. 2 Arthur Henry Jackson, No. 3 Wylie Brantly Jones, and No. 4 Alexander Jay Wurts founder. Sixteen members signed the original charter including the above four.

" Our idea was that a fraternity body small enough to be wieldy of kindred spirits with similar ideals could accomplish something for ourselves and for the school. " This statement made by Brother Arthur Henry Jackson in 1941 and tells us exactly what Gamma Delta Psi is.

Three of our founders Bros. Dann, Jones, and Jackson were old friends even before they entered high school. It was Brother Wurts who got the idea of 'Gamma' and was advised by one of his brothers who was a Yale fraternity man. Brother Wurts chose Brothers Dann, Jones, and Jackson to carry out his plan.

Alpha chapter of Gamma Delta Psi met once a week in a corner room of a top floor in Hill House High School and Brother Al Wurts held 'Gamma's' first social function in his barn. The chief bill of fare was peanuts.

Brother Wurts designed the pin in the shape of a crescent because the Fraternity was new and bound to grow just like a new moon.

In 1884, Gamma became a national fraternity with the induction of Beta Chapter at DeVeaux Military College in Suspension Bridge, N.Y. Our strength continued with the addition of Delta Chapter in 1887 at Grand Rapids High School in Grand Rapids, Michigan. 'Gamma' had begun to move. A chapter a year was added until the out break of World War I.

LET'S 'NOT' GET PHYSICAL

Remember pledging? Right, how could you possibly forget. I often have obscure flash backs to my pledge period. I must say that at times, pledging was a bearable ordeal at best. At the risk of over using a cliché, 'It is an experience I will remember for as long as I live'.

However, during my time of trial, I found pledge period to be educational, intriguing, and all too spontaneous. In retrospect, I have always been a bit too critical of the 'genuine' intentions of certain Brothers I pledged under.

I have since learned to accept the physical hazing which appears to be an innate part of pledging for Gamma Delta Psi. There have been so many incidents in which I have witnessed, that I felt a commentary was long overdue.

Two specific occurrences come immediately to mind when referring to abusive mistreatment of pledges. I can honestly say that I have been exposed to both sides, as a Brother and as a pledge.

Five years ago, I wilfully swore an oath to under take the rigors of pledge period. I did so with an open minded approach, but at the same time, I knew I would have to bear the consequences in stride. I soon discovered that the pledge's responsibilities greatly outweighed his rights.

As I entered pledge period, I was aware that there would be a limited amount of physical obligations that the pledge was expected to meet. However, I guess that I didn't realize that this was almost exclusive towards sheer physical harassment by disoriented Brothers.

I felt during my pledge period that many Brothers treated it as a circus rather than a time to educate prospective members. One incident of uncalled for physical abuse occurred during interrogation, some two and a half weeks into pledge period. With only four or five pledges remaining, we somehow built up a little bit of comradery amongst ourselves.

As the story goes, the other pledges and I planned a revolution to counter attack the unnecessary abuse being warranted by a certain Brother. Well, as we had anticipated we were laid victim to the likes of being wacked with tree branches on the back of our legs. A few other acts of unmentionables also went on. We never revolted, but only two of us made it to rituals.

It was during my second pledge period as a Brother where things got a bit carried away and out of hand. A Brother (who we'll call Steve Randall for namesake) re-introduced a small, but significant symbol of power and authority to the Brothers. We simply called this lethal instrument, the 'Paddle'.

The 'Paddle' was constructed of hard wood and approximately 18" x 4" x 1/2" in dimension. It wasn't a pleasant looking object in the eyes of a pledge. It was made even more menacing with its bright red exterior and glossy enamel white Greek lettering.

This was at the time when the movie 'Animal House' was playing and the Brothers thought of it as a throw back to the old days of enforcing discipline. You may recall the particular scene where the rival Fraternity of Delta 'spanked' their pledges in secrecy. Well, our idea paralleled that image to an extent.

Is physical hazing essential to the pledge's assimilation to the ways of our Fraternity? To some minor degree, maybe. The road to teaching pledges the ideals of Fraternity is through strategic guidance and by example.


