**President's Message**

Greetings, and welcome to this well overdue edition of your fraternal newsletter (I would call it the monthly newsletter, but let's be serious). Chuck full of fraternal ramblings and greek happenings to keep y'all up to speed.

As we bring the 1992-93 year to a close, we see GDP on the upswing after a less than impressive first semester. Contact has been established all over, and we now stand poised to once again attempt to breathe some life into this grand old fraternity of ours.

Before going into detail about the various branches of GDP, I would first like to acknowledge the newest prospective addition to the chain of brotherhood. Our latest find is an unusual type of Crescent Club, at least in my experience. We should be inducting as Gamma Sigma Chapter of GDP, if all goes well, Beta Tau Chapter (Niagara-on-the-Lake) of Gamma Sigma Fraternity, at Convention '93. If any older Brothers have any advice on this situation, please contact myself or the VP of Expansion, Justin Nelson.

As far as they know, and we have no evidence to the contrary, there is no Gamma Sigma Fraternity International to speak of at this point, nor do they even have contact with one other Chapter. They seem more than willing to make the necessary changes to their existing Chapter so that they can join the Brotherhood of Gamma Delta Psi.

So Welcome, Gamma Sigma Crescent Club, and may you be successful in becoming a Chapter in good standing of Gamma Delta Psi. Since Convention is fast approaching, I would recommend that we (myself, Justin, and the Crescent Club) get together for an afternoon to discuss exactly what is to be expected before induction. The sooner the better boys!

Now it is time to turn to that which we so often, though sometimes mistakenly, refer to as the Active Fraternity. The International Board of Control has been re-born of late. We have been holding regular meetings for a few months, on every other Sunday night, at my apartment in St. Catharines. The present Board has 6 members, namely:

I have greatly appreciated the effort from Brothers, outside of Gamma Eta, at the Board level of late, CHI.

Furthering the last point, the Board still needs more participation from the other Chapters when it comes to active or alumnus membership on the Board of Control. In the North that means Gamma Alpha, and in the South that means Beta Alpha and Beta Pi. We need full representation on the Board in order to maintain our level of contact at a maximum. At Convention '93 I will be proposing (among other things) that each Chapter, from now on, elect a National Board Delegate (probably an alumnus), who may serve as an officer on the IBC, or just as an interested onlooker for your Chapter at Board Meetings, etc. This, like many of my proposals at this year's Convention, are not new or original, but have been discovered in our own history, mainly old constitutions. It's amazing some of the things you can find when you look. I hope that the Chapters will take this idea seriously and come to Convention with their Chapter's representative in mind.

The state of the Chapters themselves varies considerably at this point. As for my own Chapter, Gamma Eta, we are experiencing a resurgence of late that has greatly increased my enthusiasm for the Fraternity. I would personally have difficulty acting as IBC President knowing my Chapter was not healthy.

I'd like to send a message directly to the Brothers of Gamma Eta here, if I may. As I have mentioned during meetings, I could not imagine having someone my present age around when I was 18. I hope that having the 'voice of authority' around so much this year did not infringe on the natural progress of the Chapter. I have always thought of the Chapter as a place where young men could be free from many of the constraints of parents/teachers/etc., and be given the chance to function as adults, make many of their own decisions, suffer from their mistakes, etc. In other words, to LIVE. If by hanging around and trying to re-build the Chapter as it once was has somehow negatively affected this, I would like to apologize. There are probably many new and perfectly legitimate improvements to Chapter life that I cannot see through my traditional eyes. I hope that some of these can be realized in the coming year.

Next a quick look at the rest of the Chapters mentioned in the reports to follow. I attended a Beta Xi meeting recently and found enthusiasm and total membership in fine shape. What I did not see was much in the way of officer's doing their jobs. I would recommend immediate copies of the Officer's Handbook for all officers, at the very least. All I can say about Gamma Alpha is that they made the road trip to a few of our dances this year (where were you for the last one?), and sure know how to kill a keg before noon. Hope to hear from you Alphans soon (having a meeting, party, whatever!). Beta Pi is now in the capable hands of one Robbie Peden, our new SVP, as well as Brothers Dustin Durham and Kevin Burton. We all hope that the South will rise again real soon.

Lastly, a look at Beta Alpha Chapter. Recent contact has been established with Brothers Valex Dotario and Micheal Eckstein regarding the re-activation of Beta Alpha. Valex has said that there are a number of Brothers and new guys that are showing an interest. If any of y'all read this, contact us a.s.a.p. (Ben, where are you???)

The next concern I would like to address is the one involving the Trustees and the Trust Fund. At this time I am attempting to organize a conference of Brothers, to include the newly appointed members of the Board of Trustees (if you read this Gus, call me), the last official full Board of Trustees (present signatories to the Trust Fund), as well as a few older Trustees (the Grand Brothers) to serve as mediator(s) during these discussions.

It is critical to the future of GDP that this conference take place so that we can all begin to work toward a common goal, and stop dwelling on past disagreements. We need to discuss the future roll of the Board of Trustees, and what the future may hold for GDP as a whole. It is up to the older members to show the newer ones that this is NOT just another fraternity, and they were not deceived as pledges.

Of central concern to the active fraternity is the status of the Trust Fund. A quick re-cap of the situation would go something like this:

- it is presently in the hands of the 'former' Board of Trustees (all terms have expired)

- they have stated very clearly that they would not be handing over control to the 'new' BOT

- besides that, according to Art.VIII, Part C, Sect.4, "the monies in this fund shall be held for emergency use at the discretion of the BOT or as directed by a unanimous vote of the delegates present at the annual convention."

- at Convention '88 and again at Convention '90, the delegates unanimously declared a 'state of emergency', and decided to free up, to a maximum of 50% or approx. \$2500 (the total was unknown at this time as no report had been received on the status of the bonds for some time), for the following:

1. Expansion - improved leaflets, kits, etc.
2. Publications - Constitutions (copies & covers), Pledge Manuals (professionally done), and copies of the rest.
3. Trophies - need refurbishing and updating.
4. Jewellery & Paraphernalia - a small supply of pins and a few items of paraphernalia should be kept in stock.

At present I am told that there are \$5500 in Bonds and \$1700 or so in the bank account. The 'former' BOT still maintains control of this. They say they are saving it for the future. I would submit that unless we get serious about investing in the expansion and re-activation of this organization, it may not have a future worth discussing.

On to yet another fascinating facet of our illustrious organization, that which is known as Gamma Psi Fraternity International.

The Northern IBC (minus Nyeness) recently attended an Alumni Family Picnic, which was organized by Alpha Alpha Chapter of Gamma Psi (The Alumni Chapter). Though I must admit that I was thoroughly unprepared for the resultant crowd, it was a magnificent showing of Brothers and their families. I have never in my 12 years as a Brother attended a fraternal event where I knew so few. I must

send out my appreciation to the organizers; Randy Picardat, Dennis Breckenmaker, and Larry Belcher, for proving to me personally that Gamma is certainly alive and well within Gamma Psi. I hope that we can work together in the year to come and accomplish a great deal more than if we did not.

If you are serious about the Gamma Retreat, then I suggest we commence the compilation of a series of writings on fraternity, and begin regular correspondence on same, to ensure that we have an understanding of what each of us would like to see come out of such an exercise. (The Gamma Papers ?)

I'd like to ask a few questions here that I hope someone could answer for me soon. Is AA conducting regular meetings? If so, has anyone attempted to contact the Brothers of Beta Alpha or Beta Pi, and invited them to get a good look at a proper meeting, complete with parliamentary procedure? Would AA like to submit a regular column to the Grip in 1993/94? Does AA have anything formalized, on paper, that I can use as a guide to start a similar Chapter in St. Catharines? Have you contacted Grand Brother Jamieson regarding Alumni contacts?

Turning to the Active Gamma Psi, who is the President? Is there a contact/ mailing list available? Has the expansion leaflet been updated? Are copies available? Could someone send me an expansion package/kit, so I can attempt Brock U in the fall? So many questions, so little space...

The Big 'C' this year (that's Convention for you rookies) will be held in the South, on the Canadian long weekend, July 30-Aug. 2. Exact locations are unavailable at this time, but we are most likely to end up in Hopewell or Col. Hgts., VA. Brothers Eckstein and Peden should be hard at work to find us 1/ a place for meetings (fri. night, sat. afternoon, and sun. afternoon), 2/ a place for dinner (sat. evening), and 3/ a place to sleep (if necessary), for a week or so. Call either of them or myself for up-to-the-minute details.

We have a great deal of work to do at this year's Convention so it would be nice to see at least 2 members from each Chapter at each meeting of the Convention (the delegate and alternate, preferably). If you want your Chapter to have a say in how the Fraternity is to operate in the coming year, your representatives should be there. Costs this year will be kept to a minimum to encourage as many actives, especially those in the neighbourhood, to attend as much of Convention as possible. Attention Gamma Alphans! Gamma Eta will probably be renting cars again (or a van), so get in touch soon if you are interested. Chapters with outstanding 1992-93 dues are encouraged to make some form of payment at the Convention (yo Gamma Alpha, a block perhaps?) so as to avoid the suspension of voting privileges. Till then...I remain...

In keeping with a general trend of society in the 90's to be environmentally concerned ( a trend which I strongly support), I would like us to use this space to increase the awareness of GDP and it's Brothers on subjects related to the environment.

I hope some Brothers will take an interest and send me facts that they may have come across to fill this page in future Grips. I'd also like to see the Chapters and their pledges getting out and doing something next year, for the environment that is.

When it comes to environmental concerns, many people simply overlook the obvious, or are conditioned to accept things as they are. For this month's Grip, I'd like to look at what is probably the biggest and at the same time the most obvious disaster, if you live in southern Ontario. Our Great Lake.

A century ago, one could drink the water, eat the fish, and swim all day long. Today, our drinking water (in St.Kitts) comes from Lake Gibson (after extensive treatment), nobody eats the fish (most of them have cancerous growths), and the beaches have been closed for years (so everyone gets a backyard pool).

Why? The reasons are many. The steel industry in Hamilton, chemical dumps in Niagara Falls, New York, or General Motors and the Ontario Paper Co, on the Welland ship Canal. A less obvious or less reported problem is that raw sewage goes directly in to Lake Ontario, during major rainfalls because most treatment plants can't handle the volume of water that results.

Though the majority of people are not in the position to make a huge difference on their own, the first step is to become aware of what's happening, then, perhaps, if enough people voice their opinions, the powers that be will have little choice but to listen.

### Greenpeace Update:

A 6 year campaign to eliminate one of the worst sources of toxic chemicals in the Great Lakes made an enormous breakthrough in February. The Ontario Government agreed to ban Chlorine leaching in the pulp and paper industry. The campaign is now focusing on East Asia and the U.S. The main target in the U.S. is Time Magazine who reneged on a promise a year ago to make their products (People, Time, and Sports Illustrated) worldwide chlorine free.

Percent of U.S. citizens with measurable levels of chlorinated dioxins in their tissues- 100

Number of organochlorines identified in U.S. and Canadian population - 177 (update by G. Perks, stats by J. Thornton and J. Palter).


