Happy Founder's Day | 130 Years

VAUGHAN, ON – Every year around Easter, I find my thoughts turning to Founder's Day – April 13 – with impassioned hope that one day we will embrace a full and buoyant Crescent again, just as we did through our formidable years as a naïve Pledge and later as a young, effervescent Brother.

As much as I am an ardent proponent of Alumnus activity and involvement, and their intangible value to any group, club or society, High School Fraternities should be primarily about young men, or at least remain the exclusive objective of growing their numbers for the purpose of sustainability if not outright the preservation of our Fraternity.

I have few objectives set for April 17-19, aside from the obvious bid to acquaint myself with Brothers I have missed for several years, and to meet many I have only heard or read about. If I depart next weekend at the conclusion of the events smiling and content, knowing that I had perhaps made up time for many lost years of inactivity or being disconnected, it will not be enough to satisfy my insatiable need to witness the complete life cycle of Gamma Delta Psi.

Recently, I sent out a message to the Board of Trustees and copied several interested and 'active' Alumni, announcing a proposal to re-structure the governing of Gamma Delta Psi, specifically by expanding upon the traditional roles and tasks of current (and future) Trustees by implementing several new Offices. One of the prime Offices recommended is the creation of Vice-Chairman of Expansion.

Undeniably, 'Expansion' has regressed to the point of becoming an albatross for us. We love to banter about it, scratch down dubious ideas, only to meander circuitously about how it should be implemented ad nauseam, until we have done nothing but exhaust ourselves with idle talk.

This weekend when we pass the Grip, converse about the old days and agree what a shame it is that we don't have an active membership body, let's focus on what we can do about it. What fresh ideas or untried old ones do you have? How can you make a difference? Whom do you know that could benefit from or add to the mosaic of Gamma?

The first meeting of the 150th Year Sesquicentennial Anniversary planning committee starts Friday evening.

The three-day Northern Alumni Rally started innocuously enough on the afternoon of Friday, March 27, 2009 with a planned visit to Brother Scott Crosby (Gamma Alpha), the first of six former IBC Presidents to participate to some degree in the weekend's events, at his company's headquarters, Holland & Crosby Limited, in Mississauga, Ontario. Scott was joined by Brother Kenny Martin (Gamma Theta / BOT), also a past IBC President and the always amicable and accommodating Grand Brother Kevin Stockdale (Beta Alpha + Gamma Nu), along with yours truly as willing guide.

Northern Alumni Reunion 3.28.09

The trek from Oakville to St. Catharines, somewhere under an hour, went by swiftly with anticipation over reconnecting with many Brothers from the Niagara Region. LONDON, ON – In the past, I have published articles on leadership and growth within organizations. See the ramblings entitled “Leadership” and “Growth as A Process”. One of the topics that I alluded to, without specifically addressing, was the topic that has gained popularity recently in the business world; normally called “Succession Planning”.

The topic of Succession Planning normally deals with ensuring the development of junior staff or members in order to have quality replacements for retiring executives, or otherwise vacated key positions. Succession Planning is used for businesses that don't believe they will ever cease to exist.

In the following writing, I deal with organizations that have a typically shorter “lifespan” of membership, and therefore have a greater risk of dying out. Specifically, I will talk about fraternities in the high school and higher education facilities.

One of the challenges of fraternities, at the high school or college level, is ensuring the continued existence and strength of their chapter, when the lifespan of a member, from pledge to president is no longer than 5 years. There must be, within every member, a focus and appreciation of Past, Present and Future.

The Past Focus is a knowledge and appreciation of the history and legacy of the fraternity. To appreciate the greatness of the organization, every member must be schooled in the history and traditions that came before him. This provides him with the essential attitude of continuity. Rather than feeling that he is creating a new adventure, he needs to realize that he is continuing an adventure that has been going on for years. Once he comes to this realization, he will feel a greater responsibility to ensure the quality of the Present and the continuation into the Future.

The Present Focus is ensuring that every brother gets the opportunity to grow and develop in today's plans and activities. To ensure the future and build upon the history of the past each member must be guided and counseled to be the best that they can be. This not only assists the brother in their readiness for life, but builds talent for the fraternity in their current projects.

Involvement in planning activities, whether that project is a minor fund-raiser or planning a convention, teaches the young man leadership, organization and achieving goals. This is what we do. Never forget that our mission is to prepare members for a future career and fulfilling life. By doing this we generate an appreciation and a desire to insure that others have the same opportunity.

Having a foundation built on the past and a development of skills and experiences to make a good start on the future, a brother will naturally have a desire to pass on this adventure to his younger brothers. When he acts on this desire and encourages others to do as well, he ensures our Future by constantly recruiting new blood and diligently training them on our Past and Present

Past, Present and Future: They are the three-legged stool that supports us in reaching new heights. If you remove one, we all come crashing down! Perhaps this is the reason our founders chose the trident symbol, Psi, to be part of our name. Succession Planning is normally considered to be planning for the replacement of key people. I prefer to think of it as planning for success.




